

### New Fund Aims to Add More Family Docs to Region



#### Your Donor Dollars at Work, with CEO Barney Ellis-Perry

Our Foundation exists to improve healthcare for Central and Northern Vancouver Island and we know the healthcare landscape is changing rapidly. This means we must be nimble and we must be engaged in conversations beyond the walls of the facilities we serve.

With over a third of our community not having a family doctor, we know that this issue is of huge concern to you our donors. It is also a huge concern for the leadership of NRGH and the Oceanside Health Center because many patients are forced to come to the NRGH Emergency Department and the Oceanside Urgent Care Center because they do not have family doctor. Often by the time they come to see us their conditions are more serious than they should be.

This is why I am very pleased with the forgivable loan program partnership we have developed with the Nanaimo Division of Family practice to help them attract family doctors to our community - and it's working! On January 23rd I attended the opening of the new Thrive Family Health, the first recipient family practice to receive the \$30,000 forgivable loan to support the opening of their new facility, located in North Nanaimo. They used the \$30,000 forgivable loan to fund an examination table, autoclave sterilizing machine, as well as other equipment critical to providing full spectrum family medicine services for the community.

The program also provides support for immigration legal services and small equipment grants for current and prospective family doctors in our community.



# Message from Hospital Leadership: Accreditation

Spring has sprung and NRGH teams are busy polishing up for accreditation. We use the word "polishing," as accreditation is actually an ongoing process but the formal on-site surveys and tracer reviews happen in March.

Accreditation is just one portion of our ongoing commitment to quality, and the process (every 4 years) allows us to assess quality and safety practices locally, and across the system of care. Island Health is then compared to other Canadian and global health care organizations, allowing for comparison of best practices, innovations, and required organizational practices that support best patient care. There will be a team of accreditors across Island Health during the week of March 10-15, and some will be visiting our site to review specific services and interacting with our direct care teams.

Specific areas at NRGH that are slated for an in-depth review include the Neonatal Intensive Care, Palliative Care, High Intensity Rehabilitation, Emergency Department, and Endoscopy to name a few. In addition, the surveyors will do something called a "tracer activity" which allows them to follow a patient journey and focus in on specific quality standards like medication management.

At the end of the survey there will be great feedback provided as to how the organization is doing and specific feedback to our NRGH team that will further inform our ongoing quality improvement work.








# Meet Your Foundation Team: Karen McCarthy - Manager of Strategic Initiatives & Grants
