### Donors Fund Innovation in Breast Cancer Surgery Message from Hospital Leadership


In 2023, the Operating Room at Nanaimo Regional General Hospital purchased two Sentimag Localization Systems thanks to the generosity of donors to the Nanaimo & District Hospital Foundation's 2022 Giving Tuesday campaign. One year later, the Sentimag System continues to improve the patient experience for many receiving lumpectomy surgeries for breast cancer.

Traditional techniques for lumpectomy localization procedures required patients to have a long and uncomfortable wire placed into the breast lesion or tumor on the day of

surgery. With the Sentimag System, the wire is replaced with a small 5mm Magseed which can be placed by a Radiologist well in advance. In the Operating Room, a Surgeon uses a probe to detect the Magseed and precisely excises the tissue around it. Not only is the Sentimag System better for patient comfort, but there is also an added benefit of streamlined scheduling between the Operating Room and the Medical Imaging Department.

NRGH is the first hospital in British Columbia to adopt the Sentimag technology, reflecting the Foundation's support of innovative care for patients with breast cancer. Due to our success, other centres, such as West Coast General, are working towards bringing in the Sentimag System to help improve cancer care for women across the Island. We are grateful for the opportunity to be leaders in this initiative.

## Your Donor Dollars at Work

This month the Foundation had the opportunity to fund some really interesting projects that will make an incredible impact on patient care in our region, thanks to the support of donors like you.

This includes \$12,000 for a one-year trial of new software to streamline the emergency doctor scheduling process, intended to increase available doctor hours in the Emergency Department at NRGH and ultimately reduce wait times. We also committed \$10,000 a year for five years to be a partner in an Island Health driven major dementia research program. And if you visit the hospital, you will see that work has begun on our latest construction project, a \$50,000 renovation to the main entrance foyer which will increase the comfort and efficiency for patients and their families arriving and waiting for care. But have no fear – Code Brew is open and our staff are here to serve up your favourites during construction!



# Enhancements to Psychiatric Unit Courtyard at NRGH Completed

Thanks to a generous \$20,000 donation from Island Savings, a division of First West Credit Union, significant upgrades were completed for the outdoor courtyard at the psychiatric inpatient unit of Nanaimo Regional General Hospital. This revitalization project transformed the area into a therapeutic sanctuary that aids in patient recovery and well-being.

#### Key Upgrades Included:

• Expanded Seating: More comfortable sitting areas were added for patients.



\*UPDATE: Changes to the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT) rules effective June 24, 2024 Federal <u>Budget 2024</u> proposed new changes to the AMT draft legislation released on August 4, 2023, reducing the amount of charitable donation credits that a taxpayer can deduct when calculating AMT to 80%.
