Light the Trees



This year we are Lighting the Trees for cardiac care at Nanaimo Regional General Hospital (NRGH) and Oceanside Health Centre (OHC) in Parksville.

Cardiologists Dr. Ayach, Dr. Nataranjan and Dr. Ju lead an exceptional team to ensure hearts in our communities are well looked after. Each year 8,700 patients receive cardiac care at NRGH and OHC and the demand is increasing with our growing and ageing population.





Through the renovation and expansion of dedicated cardiac spaces at NRGH and OHC as well as the purchase of urgently needed equipment, wait times for cardiac services will be greatly reduced and 95% of pre and post-surgical cardiac care will be able to be delivered right here at home. That warms our hearts immensely!

This Christmas, our goal is to raise \$750,000 of the \$1.8 million the Hospital Foundation has committed to the cardiac care and services expansion.
